

COMMUNITY UPDATES

NEW HIRES

- The Board has successfully expanded the membership base, now boasting **over 500 members**, a fivefold increase.
- **Br. Amyn Pabani** has taken charge as BIS Operations Manager
- Two prayer leaders have been appointed Sk. Ali Abo Siedah at Homewood and Br. Rashid Al Muntharee at Westside Masajid.



PREPARING THE NEXT GENERATION

- Three (3) seasoned Youth Leaders (Br. Rashid Al Muntharee, Sr. Janet Lau, and Br. Bashar Khalaaf) have been hired to enhance youth activities and services on a weekly basis, catering to all age groups.
- We are fortunate to have the Islamic Academy of Alabama as a powerful tool for the preparation of future generations.
- To encourage to take on future khateeb and community leadership role, four (4) students have been awarded BIS
 Scholarships to attend IAA, nurturing the potential of future leaders.
- We are exploring opportunities in partnership with IAA to support also our homeschooling and online students.
- A 17-seater Mercedes Benz Van has been acquired to facilitate various youth activities, demonstrating a commitment to their engagement and
- development.





IMPROVING OUR SPIRITUALITY (*

- We introduced the Quran Lab Program led by Sk. Tareq Mango, which has been remarkably successful, with an enrollment exceeding 150 students every Saturday along with Sunday Weekend School with similar numbers of students.
- The Board is actively recruiting new talents from the community pool and training new and young khateebs to enhance the quality of khutbas across all locations, resulting in a noticeable increase in attendance and active participation in all masajeds and their associated activities. Numerous renowned scholars were invited to enhance the spiritual enlightenment of our community members.

OUR NOTABLE ACHEIVEMENTS

- UAB Faculty members have generously provided free **ESL programs for sisters**, thereby contributing to their educational and personal growth.
- The celebrations of Eid ul Fitr and Eid ul Adha, along with International Food Festivals and Community Bazaars, have garnered a historically impressive attendance of over a thousand participants.
- The Board has introduced a new online platform for the nomination and election process, streamlining and enriching the democratic participation of the
- The Board has provided consistent support of about \$10,000 every month for needy families through the charity account.
- For the first time, the Udhya program was implemented for the entire community, involving the ritual slaughter of over 100 cattle.
- The Board achieved a historic milestone by raising over \$1.2 million for the HCIC Expansion project, addressing overflow issues during Friday Jumuahs, Tarawih prayers, Iftar dinners in Ramadan, and providing indoor sports facilities for both boys and girls.
- Various masjids have undergone substantial infrastructure improvements, including cleaning, repairing, painting, installation of new TV monitors, and enhanced security measures.
- A notable project has been undertaken to improve the landscaping and fencing at the BIS Cemetery.
- Ansar Room and Post-Jumuah Lunch Programs have been introduced at HCIC to further enhance the community experience.
- Very effective New Convert Education and Social Networking program
- BIS has played a pivotal role in uniting the Westside Muslim community, culminating in the creation of a brand-new masjid with a capacity for over 300
- Furthermore, BIS is now collaborating with Pelham masajid to serve the greater Birmingham area as one unified ummah.
- We are also launching a BIS Newsletter to keep the community informed and engaged.
- The Board has been proactive in addressing pressing contemporary issues, including LGBTQ+ concerns, Gaza Attacks, earthquakes in Syria, Turkey, Morocco, floods in Libya, and conflicts in Sudan and Yemen.
- BIS has been visible on all social media platforms, including TV news, expanding our media presence to reach a wider audience and effectively communicate with the community about events, initiatives, and important updates.

THE PROJECT


In response to these pressing demands, BIS (Birmingham Islamic Society) established a committee driven by the community to gather input and devise solutions. After months of brainstorming and consultations with various stakeholders and user groups, the committee, led by Mr. Maher Qashou, enlisted the services HCIC expansion project with multiple phases. Initially, a master plan was developed, which was then segmented into three distinct accompanying drawing.




THE DESIGN 🔯



construction of a two-way roadway and additional paved areas situated behind the new two-story building will be erected, featuring a gymnasium equipped with indoor sports facilities and a dining space. This space will also serve as an additional prayer area, complementing over classrooms, a clinic, a library, and other amenities. Phase 2 of the construction will involve the creation of a mezzanine to serve as a dedicated praying space for sisters within the existing Musallah, thereby allowing the downstairs area to be utilized for male congregational prayers, among many others e.g., remodeling of the into Wudu areas etc.)

What are some activities you volunteered for?


I've volunteered in almost everything from cleaning and setting up, behind-the-scenes event organization, decorating, and giving speeches.

The Eid Prayer was attended by the entire Muslim community of Birmingham and was also led by Sheikh Tariq Mango.







THE MOST SUCCESSFUL EVENT THIS YEAR..

"Our recent Qiyaam Night was a big hit. The brothers stayed at Homewood Masjid all night and the sisters at Hoover Masjid. The age groups were middle school and up and we had about 80 youth attend between both masjids. It is great when the younger kids get to interact with the older kids. Even if the older youth don't realize it, the attention they give to the younger youth is a good deed that greatly impacts their perception of brother and sisterhood. At the brother's Qiyaam Night, we all went inside the masjid to wrestle. Some of the older guys stayed outside, I asked them to go inside and 'hype up' the kids. The brothers, without needing a second push, all went inside, cheered on the kids, and wrestled with them for well over an hour. That is a lifelong memory that brings all of us closer to a love for each other that is for the sake of Allah (SWT)"





A MESSAGE FOR THE YOUTH..

"Sometimes we are taught Islam like we are lawyers. Pray this much and like this, fast this many days, give this much of your money to charity, but Islam is not about quantity. Islam is about quality. We can pray and fast every second of our lives, but it means nothing if it is not sincere and it's not bringing us closer to Allah (SWT). We can pray Isha at the masjid and that prayer can send us to hellfire OR heaven!
